LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR ANNUAL HOLIDAY

The Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006 Amendments to the 2006 Regulations remove references to family holiday and extended leave as well as the statutory threshold of ten school days. The amendments make it clear that headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Headteachers should determine the number of days a child can be away from school if the leave is granted. Please do not book your holiday during term time.
