Through our nurturing ethos, GEMs support, safeguarding systems and positive relationships, we have worked to ensure that St Pius X remains a happy, safe and welcoming community for all children.	<i>Parents recognised the importance of our Catholic mission but some were unsure about our mission statement and ARC values.</i>	This year we will continue to place Catholic Life and Mission at the centre of school life through Mission Week, Stay and Pray sessions, Celebration of the Word, class liturgies, school Masses, Harvest celebrations, Advent and Holy Week liturgies and opportunities for parents to worship alongside their children. Our mission statement and ARC values continue to be explicitly referenced in assemblies, newsletters and across the curriculum
<i>You agreed that the school makes sure pupils behave well.</i>	We have continued to maintain our high expectations for behaviour through our ARC values, restorative approaches and consistent routines. Pupils continue to learn in a calm, respectful environment where positive behaviour is recognised and celebrated.	<i>Some parents were unsure about the impact of the '33 Experiences of St Pius X</i>	During the year pupils will take part in a wide range of enrichment opportunities including retreats, educational visits, careers week, Bikeability, Mission Week, community service, sports events, faith celebrations and our 33 experiences. These experiences are designed to broaden horizons, develop character and prepare children for their future lives
<i>Some parents felt communication about learning could be improved.</i>	Throughout the year we will increase opportunities for parents to understand and engage with learning through Meet the Teacher sessions, phonics workshops, multiplication workshops, maths mornings, curriculum meetings, Share a Story sessions and STAR Books. These opportunities allow parents to see learning first-hand and support their children at home.	<i>Although only a small number of parents completed the survey, the comments highlighted the importance of listening to parents' views.</i>	We remain committed to working in partnership with families. We will continue to review how we communicate with parents and seek ways to encourage greater participation in future surveys so that feedback reflects the views of a wider cross-section of our school community.
