We will have a whole school mass on Wednesday 18th February at 10am for Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of Lent.



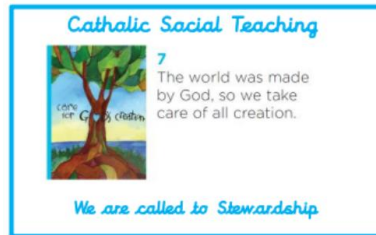
Pilgrims of Hope

If you are green fingered, or can donate any plants or gardening tools to help us with our mission, please contact the school office.



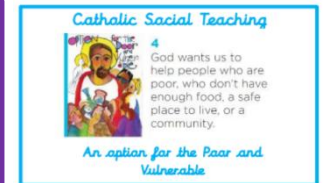
Grandparents Afternoon Tea
