At least 5 GCSEs at grade 5 and above including English & Maths.

#### **PROGRESSION**

Religious Studies at A Level can lead to higher education courses in Philosophy, Religious Studies and the Social Sciences including Sociology and Psychology.

#### **FUTURES**

Religious Studies at A Level is a qualification that shows awareness of moral issues and is highly valued by many professional job sectors. Examples of careers that many Religious Studies graduates succeed in are Finance, Teaching, Civil Service and Journalism.

#### **ASSESSMENT**

2 x 3 hour written exams, each worth 100 marks and 50% of A Level.

# **Component 2: Religion and Dialogues**

- · 4 questions; 25 marks each, 2 questions of AO1 and AO2.
- 2 further 25 mark questions 1 philosophy from a choice of 2 & 1 ethics from a choice of 2.

An A Level in Religious Studies combines well with the Social Sciences - Sociology and Psychology, Law, Geography and both English A Levels.
