

Assessment & Marking Protocol within Modern Foreign Languages

Class exercise books

- Year 7 and 8 will have a fortnightly vocabulary/grammar test marked. Exercise books will be marked at least once per three week cycle (approx twice per half-term) :
- GCSE: will have a fortnightly vocabulary/grammar test marked. Exercise books will be marked at least once per three week cycle (approx twice per half-term) :
- Agreed pieces of work will be marked with WWW and APs.
- Verbal feedback is given regularly during lessons.

Assessment of Work at Key Stage 3 (Years 7&8)

- Formal assessments, which will take place at the end of topic and during exam week, will be graded from Emerging to Extending. These are marked by the teacher and evaluated by the student.
- Classwork is monitored during lessons.
- Homework will be self, peer or teacher assessed.

Assessment of Work at Key Stage 4 (Years 9,10,11)

- Classwork is monitored during lessons.
- Homework may be self, peer or teacher assessed.
- A formal assessment will take place at the end of each topic. These are marked by the teacher and evaluated by the student.
- End of year/mock examination will be conducted to assess progress. These will be graded 9-1.

Dedicated Improvement & Reflection Time (DIRT)

• Following a bookmark, time will be given at the start of the lesson for students to respond to their APs using a red pen.

Homework

- KS3: Students will be set two pieces of homework per fortnight. One piece will consist of a learning homework (vocab or grammar) and the other piece will be identified on the scheme of work.
- KS4: Students will be given three pieces of homework per fortnight
 - Vocab learning
 - One exam question listening or reading
 - One exam style task speaking or writing

Student support

- We recommend the use of 'quizlet' and 'memrise' for students in KS3 + 4 to support the learning of vocabulary
