1. High Frequency Verbs

Learn high frequency verbs in a range of tenses.

aller	faire	être	avoir
Je vais - I go	Je fais – I do	Je suis - I am	J'ai – I have
Je suis allé(e) – I went	J'ai fait – I did	J'ai été – I have been	J'ai eu – I had
J'allais – I used to go	Je faisais – I used to do	J'étais – I was	J'avais – I used to have
J'irai – I will go	Je ferai – I will do	Je serai – I will be	J'aurai – I will have
J'irais – I would go	Je ferais – I would do	Je serais – I would be	J'aurais – I would have

2. Modal Verbs

Learn some modal verbs in French in present tense.

pouvoir	vouloir	devoir	savoir
je peux = I can	je veux = I want	je dois = I must	je sais = I know
tu peux = you can	tu veux = you want	tu dois = you must	tu sais = you know
il peut = he can	il veut = he wants	il doit = he must	il sait = he knows
elle peut = she can	elle veut = she wants	elle doit = she must	elle sait = she knows
on peut = we/one can	on veut = we want/ one wants	on doit = we must/ one must	on sait = we know/ one knows
nous pouvons = we can	nous voulons = we want	nous devons = we must	nous savons = we know
vous pouvez = you can	vous voulez = you want	vous devez = you must	vous savez = you know
ils peuvent = they can	ils veulent = they want	ils doivent = they must	ils savent = they know
elles peuvent = they can	elles veulent = they want	elles doivent = they must	elles savent = they know

ne ... rien = nothing	Je ne fais rien.
ne ... nulle part = nowhere	Je ne voyage nulle part.
ne ... aucun(e) = not a single	Je ne vois aucun arbre.
ne ... plus = anymore	Je ne parle plus.
ne ... ni ... ni ... = neither / nor	Je ne bois ni de vin, ni de bière.
