## Year 10 (year 11 in September)

As a result of legislation introduced in September 2013, the law now requires that once young people have left school at the age of 16, they must then do one of the following until they're 18:

- stay in full-time education, for example at a college
- start an <u>apprenticeship</u> or <u>traineeship</u>
- spend 20 hours or more a week working or volunteering, while in part-time education or training

Once the Autumn term begins in September, Year 11 will start the process of applying for sixth form opportunities almost straight away. As part of this we have our annual post 16 opportunities evening planned for 24th September, during which year 11 students and parents will have the opportunity to talk to local colleges and other training providers. Please note, due to the current circumstances, we are currently unsure what the format will be for this event, but we will keep you informed.

Students will have individual Careers meetings in the Autumn term with Mrs Ferros to help guide them with their college applications and provide them with information. College open days are advertised within the Post 16 opportunities booklet students will receive as well as on their Work related learning Google classroom.
