Is Art for me? Do you enjoy learning in a creative environment? An ability to draw and paint is not as important as your willingness to be involved. Success is measured in a variety of ways, not least through personal enjoyment and achievement.	
What skills will I learn? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will gain practical skills in drawing, painting, printmaking, collage, ICT, digital photography and 3D materials. You will be able to express your own thoughts and ideas through a variety of media, both 2D and 3D. You will gain a critical awareness and be able to verbalise your ideas. 	
What will I do in lessons? You will produce artwork from observation, gain inspiration from 21 st century artists and develop imaginative ideas/responses using a wide range of media. You will develop sketchbook work A1 studies, work on canvas and sculpture.	
How will I be assessed? Allocation of marks is: Coursework Portfolio of work = 60% of your GCSE Externally Set Task = 40% of your GCSE N.B. This task is a project for which you have several weeks of lessons to complete; you are continually guided/supported by your teacher and then you have a 10 hour exam to produce a final outcome using media/materials of your choice.	
Particular issues for this subject You must be prepared to continue your art studies outside of school, keeping a sketchbook and exploring ideas. For homework, you are expected to work independently as well as on set pieces. Attendance of our GCSE Art Club is encouraged. All students will attend a curriculum visit to a gallery.

You can absorb ideas from fashion, music and book shops as well as galleries and museums, e.g. Brighton and Hove Museum and Art Gallery, The Tate Modern, V&A Museum, National Portrait Gallery, The Saatchi Gallery.
