Key Stage 4 - Years 10 and 11

All students



- study GCSE English language and literature, mathematics and science
- take Core Physical Education (PE) and Personal Development (PD) which includes Core Religious Education and Citizenship
- study other GCSE or equivalent vocational subjects that they have some choice over (the option subjects)

Most students

• will include a humanities subject (History or Geography) and a Modern Foreign Language (French, German or Spanish) in their option subjects

Key Stage 4 - Years 10 and 11

Some students

- will not be required to study a Modern Foreign Language but will still take four option subjects
- will follow an alternative curriculum in place of a Humanities subject and a
 Modern Foreign Language



GCSE or non-GCSE?

- Both cover the full range of outcomes
- Perfectly acceptable to combine both
- Both support progression onto a wide range of post-16 courses **GCSEs**
 - Graded 1 to 9
- Most are assessed by examinations only, apart from Art, Drama, Engineering, Music, Photography and PE

Non-GCSEs

- Different grading systems but cover the equivalent range of outcomes
- More practical approach to learning with links to the workplace
- Assessment based largely on evidence produced by the student deadlines!
- One examination







- Students who have been studying two languages in Year 9 may, if they wish, select the second language in *C* or *D*.
- Students may select the second Humanities subject in *Options C or D* if they wish to take Geography and History.

Checklist



Make sure you have:

- taken the time to find out everything you need to about the courses on offer before making your choices,
- make appointments to speak with teachers on 3 / 4 February
- included a reserve choice in Option D,
- not selected the same subject more than once,
- completed the options process in INSIGHT by **Thursday 11 February**,

Students following pathway A must have a language selected in option A.

Allocation of option choices

- Once you have selected your options, we will try to meet your preferred choices (make sure your 'reserve' choice is as well thought out as your other choices).
- Are these choices guaranteed? Not necessarily...
- Possible reasons might be:
 - Numbers too low for course to run
 - Your suitability for the course
 - Your combination cannot be timetabled



When will my choices be confirmed?

- No news is good news!
- If your combination is unsuccessful or the course is not running we will communicate this with you.

• Letters will be issued during the summer term to confirm which option subjects your child will be studying in Year 10

What happens if I change my mind?

Do not panic!

Come and speak to me as there may be a solution
