

Support and Guidance

Happy students are the ones that make the most progress. As a consequence, we place particular importance on pastoral care and personal development.

At Oathall our pastoral care is based around a year group structure. We also incorporate the traditional house system; Discovery, Endeavour, Pioneer and Voyager. Under the guidance of the Head of Year, a non-teaching Assistant Head of Year and the group tutor, every student becomes known and nurtured and supports each other.

Oathall offers a whole-school approach to support learning for the most to the least able. Students across the ability range may experience a range of learning, physical, social or emotional needs. We work closely with students, parents, subject and pastoral staff to identify, monitor and make provision for meeting individual needs.

High achievement for every student is developed in an environment of challenge and support. Careful, regular monitoring of progress in each subject enables targets for improvement to be set and guides parents in supporting their child.

New developments at Oathall

At Oathall we constantly look for ways to improve the college facilities so that we provide inspirational surroundings in which to learn as well as excellent resources for students to use.

Our most recent major building project was a complete rebuild of our science and maths building. This was formally opened in 2018 by Sir Paul Nurse FRS. Oathall has always had a reputation for excellence in science and maths. In completing this project our aim was to create a faculty that would inspire our students to develop their passion for maths and science.

We have a rolling programme to refresh and upgrade our existing learning spaces and are currently working on ensuring all our classrooms are equipped with interactive digital screens, new classroom furniture as well as new floor finishes, lighting, and decoration.

And, we have just started work with West Sussex County Council, developing exciting new plans to improve and enhance our dining room and kitchen facilities. r students to develop their passion for maths and science.
