# Praise & Consequence Procedure

<b>A1</b>	<p><b>Outstanding behaviour &amp; contribution in class</b></p> <p><b>Praise:</b> x1 credit awarded on PARS, teacher praise, working towards credit certificates (Bronze, Silver &amp; Gold)</p>
<b>A2</b>	<p><b>Good behaviour &amp; contribution in class</b></p> <p><b>Praise:</b> Teacher praise, conversation with student; how can an A1 be achieved next time?</p>
<b>A3</b>	<p><b>Behaviour concern</b> Disruption, rudeness, defiance, poor uniform, lack of equipment, insufficient work produced.</p> <p><b>Consequence for student:</b> 1 behaviour point</p> <p>No change in behaviour: student removed faculty rota system applied. 30 min teacher DT parents contacted</p>
<b>A4</b>	<p><b>Persistent behaviour concern</b> Failure to change behaviour, rudeness or defiance that affects others and harms the classroom ethos that prevents learning, refusing safe house. Call out removal by senior team.</p> <p><b>Consequence for student:</b> 2 behaviour points, 60 min faculty DT after school, parents contacted</p>

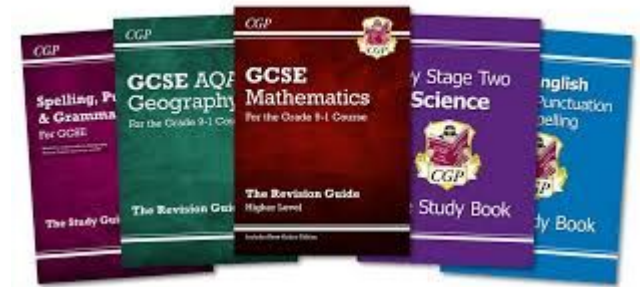

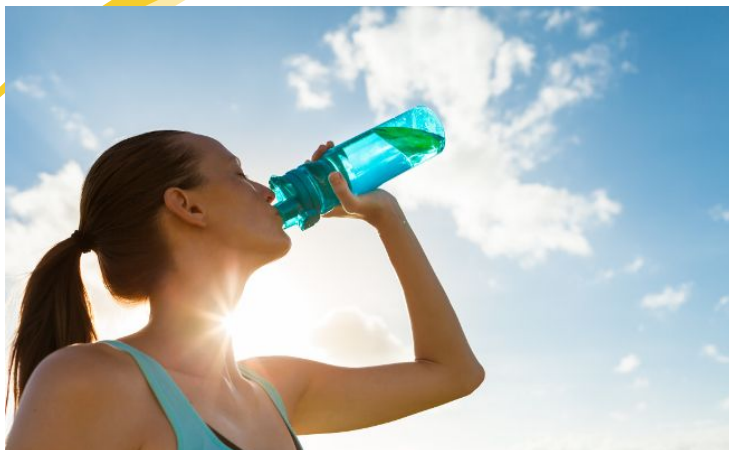
