What is BTEC Tech Award in Performing Arts (Dance and Drama)

The BTEC Tech Award is an introduction to vocational learning. The qualification gives learners the opportunity to build skills that show an aptitude for further learning. There is no limit to progression options as the skills acquired are applicable to a range of post-16 study options.

The components focus on:

- the development of core knowledge and understanding of a range of dance/drama styles and disciplines, and the key features that contribute to these such as practitioners' roles, responsibilities, skills and techniques.
- the development and application of skills such as: practical and interpretative, rehearsal and performance(s) in dance and drama through workshops and classes.
- reflective practice through the development of skills and techniques that allow learners to respond to feedback and identify areas for improvement using relevant presentation techniques, for example a logbook.

What skills will I learn?

The Award gives learners the opportunity to develop sector-specific knowledge and skills in a practical learning environment. The main focus is on four areas of equal importance, which cover the:

- development of key skills that prove learners' aptitude in dance/drama, such as reproducing repertoire or responding to stimulus
- process that underpins effective ways of working in the dance/drama, such as development of ideas, rehearsal and performance
- attitudes that are considered most important in dance/drama, including personal management and communication
- knowledge that underpins effective use of skills, processes and attitudes in the sector, such as roles, responsibilities, performance disciplines and styles.

Content of the course:

Component 1 Exploring the Performing Arts

Aim: get a taste of what it's like to be a professional dancer.

During Component 1, your students will:

- explore performance styles, creative intentions and purpose
- investigate how practitioners create and influence what's performed
- discover performance roles, skills, techniques and processes.

Assessment: internally assessed assignments

Weighting: 30% of total course

Component 2 Developing Skills and Techniques in the Performing Arts

Aim: develop skills and techniques in dance.

During Component 2, your students will:

- take part in workshops, classes and rehearsals
- gain physical, interpretative and rehearsal skills
- apply these skills in performance
- reflect on their progress, their performance and how they could improve.

Assessment: internally assessed assignments

Weighting: 30% of total course

Component 3 Performing to a Brief

Aim: consider how practitioners adapt their skills for different contexts, and put this into practice in a performance.

To achieve this aim, your students will:

- use the brief and previous learnings to come up with ideas
- build on their skills in classes, workshops and rehearsals
- review the process using an ideas and skills log
- perform a piece to their chosen audience
- reflect on their performance in an evaluation report.

Assessment: externally assessed task, where students work in groups of between 3 and 7 members to create a performance based on a set brief.

Weighting: 40% of total course.

How will I be assessed?

The course is made up of three components: two that are internally assessed and one that's externally assessed. The three-block structure; explore, develop and apply, has been developed to allow students to build on and embed their knowledge. This allows them to grow in confidence and then put into practice what they have learned. The assessment structure is also designed so that students can build on what they learn, and develop their skills, as they move through the course.

Particular issues for this subject

This course is a combination of practical and theoretical work. You will be expected to participate fully in all practical lessons and apply yourself to all coursework assignments that you are given.

You must wear the correct attire at all times. Your teacher will tell you what is needed.

You must be organised and committed to meet all deadlines set. You do not need to be the best dancer or actor or have any previous experience, but you must be prepared to give your best at all times.

You must be prepared to perform in front of people.
