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# CONSULTATION ON THE PROPOSAL TO FEDERATE NURSERY SCHOOLS HETTON LYONS, OXCLOSE AND USWORTH COLLIERY NURSERY SCHOOLS

5th July 2021

#### Dear Parents and Carers,

The Headteachers and Governing Boards of Hetton Lyons, Oxclose and Usworth Colliery Maintained Nursery Schools have prepared a formal consultation document.

The proposal they have, is to make our nursery schools stronger and better in the future, by joining the three nursery schools in a Federated school's partnership. The name of the planned Federation will be the HOUse Federation.

A school federation is defined in the Education Act 2002 as two or more maintained schools operating under a single governing body. The School Governance (Federations) (England) Regulations 2012 set out the structure and arrangements for leaving, joining and dissolving a federation.

For the most part, nothing will change in the three nursery schools on a day-to-day basis, the Federation will involve making one, instead of three, Governing Boards who will have responsibility for the three schools.

- It is not a merger with a primary school, which would cause the nursery school to close.
- It is not a proposal to join a Multi Academy Trust or MAT. Maintained nursery schools cannot join an Academy under current legislation
- A Federated approach is the model which best suits our three schools and will make us stronger together in partnership.

A number of nursery schools in England have formed, or are forming, Federated partnerships and we feel that this would be a strong and positive action to take for our three schools.

- We have planned a formal consultation which collects the views of all involved with the three nursery schools. This begins on July 12th and ends on August 23rd.
- We want as many people as possible to respond to the consultation. Your views are very important to us and help us to shape future developments to improve our schools.
- If the majority of people consulted agree to the Federation, there are legal steps to follow next and it is most likely that this will be complete between November 2021 and January 2022.

We have created a summary of the key information, which may help you to decide if you agree or disagree with the proposals. We did this by outlining the information which we think will affect our families most, to help you to make your decisions.













A full copy of the consultation document can be collected from the school by anyone who wishes to have this. We look forward to reading your responses which will help us to plan our future actions.

# What would a Federation mean for Hetton Lyons, Oxclose Community, and Usworth Colliery Nursery Schools?

#### What are the benefits of a Federation?

The chief benefits for all schools will include:

- Sustainability which will ensure maintained nursery schools remain in the local community.
- Improved opportunities and outcomes for children,
- Improved opportunities for staff,
- Better leadership development and talent management,
- Improved shared governance
- Strengthened capacity to support Early Years education in Sunderland.

#### What Would Stay the same?

#### Each school would keep its own identity and name. It is not a merger of schools.

- Children would continue to be taught in their school although some activities may be shared. For example, family services, professional services, out of school provision, provision for children with special educational needs or disabilities.
- Each school would continue to receive its own budget and be subject to all current funding protocols, reporting mechanisms and financial regulations.
- Each school would be inspected separately by Ofsted.
- Admission arrangements would not change.
- Existing members of staff would remain employed by Sunderland City Council on the same contract of employment.

#### What would change?

- The Federation will be a new legally constituted entity. It will be called The House Federation
- The three separate Governing Boards would be dissolved and replaced by a single, newly appointed Governing Board with responsibility for all three schools.
- The new Governing Board would be responsible for school budgets and would determine how expenditure could be most effectively used across the Federation.
- There would be a single shared senior leadership structure.
- Closer working between schools would provide opportunities for career progression and professional opportunities.
- Some activities may be shared. For example, family services, professional services, out of school provision, provision for children with special educational needs or disabilities.

#### **Summary of the Proposal**

One of the key roles for all school Governing Boards is to set the strategic direction for the schools for which they have responsibility. The Governing Boards of Hetton Lyons, Oxclose and Usworth Colliery Nursery Schools have agreed that children, staff and the communities of the schools would benefit from a greater and more formal level of collaboration between the three schools.

Each school will continue to work closely with their primary feeder schools to ensure the Federation works for each individual community.













Federation provides a more sustainable environment for both children and staff to flourish. The structure of a Federation enables the schools to share their resources and expertise, e.g. curriculum development, leadership, teaching expertise and facilities, which would help sustain the performance and excellent outcomes for all children.

Federation provides staff with opportunities for professional development through joint activities and training as well as career progression while remaining as schools in their own right.

The Governing Boards believe that a hard Federation between Hetton Lyons, Oxclose and Usworth schools would also strengthen and enhance the services provided for pre-school age children by enabling staff to share their early years' expertise.

Each school would retain its own identity, would retain its own budget and would be inspected separately by Ofsted. The schools would have a shared senior leadership team and the three existing Boards of Governors will disband on the federation date and a new governing body will be established, with opportunities for representatives from the existing governing bodies to be appointed to the new governing body.

The consultation period starts on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> July 2021 and will run for six weeks until Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2021.
