Physical Environment

Single-storey building with wide corridors and level access points. Wheelchair-accessible entrances and internal doors. Emergency signage and lighting throughout. One accessible toilets with handrails and emergency cords.

Curriculum

Follows the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. Staff development through CPD and self-evaluation. Additional support and resources provided as needed. External specialist input sought when appropriate.

Information

Written materials available in large print or explained in person. Translations provided for heritage languages. Information accessible via the school website.

Management and Implementation

Governors and the senior leadership team, including the SENCO, will consult with external agencies and the Local Authority as needed.
