YEAR 12 CURRICULUM OVERVIEW (START A-LEVEL GERMAN AQA 7662)

- Students will complete a bridging unit between GCSE and A-Level study.
- Students will learn about aspects of German- speaking society, and political and artistic culture in the German-speaking world.
- Students will learn explicit exam strategy for A-Level listening and reading question types for the Paper 1 exam, including translation into and out of German.
- Students will learn how to use cultural knowledge to justify their points of view, explain what other people believe and compare this to the past and what it may be like in the future. Students will learn how to interpret written information in order to give a verbal reaction to it.
- Students will learn about the themes, characters and socio historical context of the German film Good Bye Lenin. Students will learn how to write analytical paragraphs about the film.
- Students will follow an explicit grammar programme in which they will learn how to independently form and use all key tenses, recognise different types of verbs, accurately apply word order, case and adjective ending rules, as well as other key grammar points.



Year 13 German



AUTUMN TERM

START: Immigration (Einwanderung)

- Explain the main reasons why people migrate
- Evaluate the advantages and disadvantages of immigration for immigrants and the country of destination
- Examine issues affecting a countries migration policy

START: Integration (Integration)

- Discuss how the German government promotes the integration of migrants and refugees
- Discuss elements which prevent integration
- Discuss and compare the positive and negative experiences of migrants and refugees in Germany

- Discuss how the EU has evolved and Germany's role within it
- Discuss the advantages and disadvantages of the EU for Germany
- Understand the impact of EU expansion on Germany

START: Politics and Young People (Die Politik und die Jugend)

- Discuss the ways and the extent to which young people engage in politics
- Discuss priorities for youth politics in Germany
- Discuss the priorities of young people and the role of pressure groups

START: The Reunification and its Consequences (die Wiedervereinigung und ihre Folgen)

- Discuss the events and developments which led to German reunification
- Discuss and contrast the desired and actual outcome of reunification
- Discuss and compare the culture and identity of the old and new federal states

YEAR 13 CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

- Students will learn about aspects of German- speaking society, and political and artistic culture in the German-speaking world.
- Students will consolidate their understanding of exam strategy for A-Level listening and reading question types for the Paper 1 exam. Students will learn how to cope with more complex and detailed texts.
- Students will consolidate their understanding of how to use cultural knowledge to justify their points of view, explain what other people believe and compare this to the past and what it may be like in the future. Students will learn how to paraphrase written information in order to give a verbal reaction to it.
- Students will learn about the themes, characters and sociohistorical context of the German text Der Besuch der alten Dame. Students will learn how to write an analytical essay about the film and the play.
- Students will follow an explicit grammar programme in which they will consolidate year 12 grammar in and learn further, more complex grammar points.
- Students will undertake an independent research project on a topic of their choosing that they will present in their Paper 3 exam. Students will learn how to present their findings analytically in order to come to conclusions.
