### YEAR 12 CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

In the autumn term, students will complete the first two of three externally examined units, which are worth ½ respectively of their final qualification grade - these are Unit 2 Equality, Diversity & Rights and Unit 3 Health, Safety & Security. In the spring and summer term, students will complete an internally assessed coursework unit which is worth ½ of of their final qualification grade - this is Unit 1 Building Positive Relationships. At the end of the spring term there will also be a second opportunity to sit Unit 2 and Unit 3, students will be supported through this using a structured revision programme to prepare them utilising retrieval and exam technique to consolidate knowledge and understanding of all the necessary specification content. Students will be supported by an independent revision that can be completed at home. Students will then begin their penultimate unit of internally assessed coursework, which is worth 1/12 of their final qualification grade - this is Unit 10 Nutrition for Health as well as completing two workbooks which bridge the knowledge and understanding of body systems and malfunctions, for Unit 4 Anatomy & Physiology, ahead of year 13.
