OUR GOAL

Encourage all students to aspire, flourish academically, make good choices and understand what they need to do to succeed in their future.

WHAT IS THE 'OPTIONS' PROCESS?

- This is the process where students choose the subjects to study for the next two years into Yr 10 & 11
- The KS4 curriculum is broken into 2 components;
 - ***Core curriculum*** - 30 hours per fortnight
 - ***Options curriculum*** - 20 hours per fortnight

English Language (AQA):

Paper 1 – Explorations in Creative Reading and Writing - 50%



Paper 2 – Writers' Viewpoints and Perspectives - 50%

Speaking and Listening Assessment

English Literature (AQA):

Paper 1 - Shakespeare and 19th Century novel 40%

Paper 2 - Modern play and Poetry - 60%



The 'Core' Curriculum - Mathematics - Mr Lamb

Content

It is a continuation of the work that they have completed throughout KS3 and still focuses on 6 areas:

- Number
- Algebra
- Ratio and proportion
- Geometry and measure
- Probability
- Statistics




How it's assessed:

- 1 non-calculator exam
- 2 calculator exams
- Each lasts 1 hour and 30 minutes
- 80 marks each (240 marks in total)

Foundation/Higher

- Two tiers of entry
- Students sitting foundation can achieve grades 1 - 5
- Students sitting higher can achieve grades 4 - 9
- Grades 4 and 5 (crossover) are assessed on both papers
- Decisions on the tier of entry for students will not be made until the second half of year 11



The 'Core' Curriculum - Science - Mr Vieito



Combined Science (2 GCSEs)	Triple Science (3 GCSEs)
8 hours of Science per fortnight	14 hours of Science per fortnight
6 exams, 1 hour 15 minutes long.	6 exams, 1 hour 45 minutes long.
The scores papers are added together.	Students get a separate GCSE grade in each of the Sciences, based on the two papers in that discipline.
The total score determines the two grades awarded.	For example you could get: <i>GCSE Biology 7</i> <i>GCSE Chemistry 6</i> <i>GCSE Physics 7</i>
For example you could get: <i>GCSE Combined Science 6/6 or 6/5</i> <i>but not 6/4</i>	
Either pathway allows for A-level study - minimum grade 6 preferably 7



Who chooses Triple Science?

Once you have started a subject we expect you to stick with it for the full two years- Talk to the people who know you best- Listen to the advice your subject teachers give you 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Choose a subject just because your friend has chosen it, friendships may change with time but your GCSE grades will remain with you forever, you also may end up in different groups- Choose or disregard a subject because of any particular teacher. They may not end up teaching you
