School Uniform Policy

The purpose of this policy is to provide staff, students, parents/ carers and all other stakeholders with a clear understanding of the approach the school takes to ensure our school uniform promotes the ethos of the school. Our school uniform enables us to promote a sense of identity, to avoid divisiveness and help create and foster in every student a sense of personal pride and pride in the school.

Our school aims:

We want our young people to:

- Strive for excellence wherever and however they can
- Develop their values and learn to live by them
- Participate actively

We shall:

- Strive for excellence
- Create a hardworking and caring, safe and stimulating community
- Work in partnership with our parents and carers and local, national and international organisations to enrich our outcomes

In this policy we aim to outline how we will:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for school uniforms so that it promotes the ethos of the school and sets an appropriate tone for education.

Prudhoe Community High School Uniform

We will make sure our uniform is available at a reasonable cost and provides the best value for money for parents/carers. Specialist items such as blazers, the school skirt and school ties can be purchased from our uniform supplier [Salto UK Ltd](#). The remainder of the uniform can be purchased from most high street stores and supermarkets.

Students must wear the school uniform at all times when they are at school or on a school visit, unless otherwise stated. Our uniform is worn with pride and any item

(including pin badges) carrying unacceptable slogans, statements or images of a political nature are prohibited.

Compulsory for all students in Y9 – 11

- Grey school blazer with embroidered logo
- School tie
- Plain white school shirt with a top button
- Plain black trousers. School trousers should be plain black tailored school trousers. Trousers that are 'skinny fit', tight or short length are not permitted.

Optional

- Students can choose to wear the Grey checked school skirt (purchased from Salto). This should be no shorter than just above the knee and should be only the grey checked skirts available from Salto. No other skirts should be worn. Plain black socks / tights should be worn with the skirt.
- Plain grey V-neck jumper

School Shoes

- School shoes must be plain black school shoes made of a polishable material. We do not permit high boots, ankle boots, (e.g. Uggs, etc) high visibility buckles/bows/coloured laces or tags etc. Trainers or canvas shoes are not permitted. More information and examples can be found on the school website.

PE Kit

Compulsory

- Navy/sky hooded top or Rugby shirt with school logo
- Navy/sky polo shirt with school logo
- Suitable trainers that lace up (this must be a different pair to school shoes)
- Students need to select from either shirts, skort, leggings or tracksuit bottoms as outlined below.

Optional

- Plain (no sports brand logos) navy/black track/ jogging pants
- Plain (no sports brand logos) navy/black running leggings
- Plain (no sports brand logos) navy/black shorts
- School shorts or Skort are available to purchase from Salto.
- Navy/sky knee length football socks

Please note:

- Boots (no metal studs or blades) or Astro trainers suitable for the 4g pitch
- Shin pads for hockey and football
- Gum shield for hockey/rugby
- Students require cotton socks for trampolining

Please also note

- Jewellery is not allowed. Any piercing where a retainer is required is not allowed. Students cannot wear retainers. Any student wearing jewellery will be asked to remove it and place it in their school bag. If a student does not comply with this request a sanction will be given. Please see the school behaviour policy for further guidance on sanctions.
- Nails that are natural should be of a suitable length for school.
- Hairstyles must be sensible and suitable for school and learning.
- Makeup should be natural in its appearance.
- Acrylic nail extensions / eyelash extensions are not allowed in school and students will be asked to remove them. If students do not comply they will be placed in isolation.
- Outdoor wear – No outdoor wear, such as coats, hats, scarves must be worn in the building and no baseball caps to be worn on the school site
- Students should only wear the grey school jumper – hoodies and other alternative jumpers are not permitted.

Sixth Form Dress Code

Although there is no uniform in the Sixth Form, students are expected to be appropriately dressed for lessons. Facial piercing, tracksuit bottoms, camouflage trousers and sports tops are not permitted. Further guidance can be found in the Sixth Form Prospectus. The Sixth Form are expected to be smart and follow similar patterns to staff dress, i.e. dress standards acceptable in business and work environments. Lanyards are required every day and must be worn visibly.

Expectations of Parents

- Parents must support their child by ensuring they have the correct uniform available to them and by not purchasing incorrect styles. Please contact us in advance of purchase if you are unsure and we will confirm.
- Please do not allow our child to bring any non uniform items such as hoodies etc into school.
- Similarly, please do not allow your child to colour their hair or get acrylic nails as they are not permitted and this creates conflict.

Please contact school immediately if your child is not in full uniform and advise them to present to pastoral by 8.30am so that we can ensure they are dressed appropriately for the day ahead.

Maintaining Uniform Standards

- If a student arrives at school in the incorrect uniform, they must report to pastoral before 8.30am to borrow appropriate uniform.
- If there is no uniform to borrow then the student will be given one day's grace. After this time, or where there is no parental explanation, students will then work in isolation until rectified.
- A doctor's note must be provided where, for medical reasons, students cannot wear school shoes
- Lockers are available for students to store coats during the school day

Second Hand Uniform Provision

We encourage all students and parents to donate any unwanted uniform that remains in good condition. This can be taken directly to pastoral or to the main reception.

Equipment

We expect that students to bring the following items into school every day:

- A suitable school bag
- Personal Organiser
- School books
- Stationery – Pen (black and green), pencil, ruler, rubber and maths equipment.
- Scientific calculator

For all uniform we reserve the right to determine suitability for school
