The Blue Planet: How will what I do today impact tomorrow?

During the Spring term, KS1 children will embark on an expedition to learn more about how their everyday activities impact the world around them.

Following their previous expedition, How can I be a hero in my community?, the children will continue developing their understanding about the pressing climate change agenda and how small collective actions, such as creating a wildflower meadow, litter picking and providing food sources for birds, animals and insects in their immediate locality can impact positively on this.

The expedition will focus on **science**, **geography** and **art**.

As **scientists**, the children will look at habitats, adaptations, survival needs, lifecycles and food chains. As **geographers**, they will investigate weather patterns, climate change, oceans and continents and compare the UK to a non-European country.

As artists, the children will continue developing their art skills, while also looking at the technique of collaging and sculpting.

Experts and Fieldwork:

Across the case studies we are looking forward to inviting in experts such as ornithologists, The Tree Council, carpenters, vets and Greenpeace activists.

Our field work will see us visiting The Deep to learn more about sea creatures and habitats under the water.

Family Learning:

We are looking forward to inviting you to work with your children to create some animal themed arts and crafts.

Final Product and Celebration of Learning:

Our final product will see the children's help to develop a mini eco-garden in the KS1 area. We will be working with the Tree council to plant trees, wildflowers and hedges before adding bug hotels and bird feeders to help care for our local wildlife, insect and bird population.
