Year: Reception

Term – Autumn 1

In Autumn 1, we are all about getting to know each other and becoming friends. The projects will be about friendships, being kind and working together. Playing a variety of team building games to encourage positive relationships.

We will be playing games together, talking about the families and learning to express our feelings using the story of the Colour Monster.

This is a great time to learn and implement the 5 C's. These are; Care, Commitment, Collaboration, Choice and Communication.

The 5th and 6th week are all about Autumn. We will be discovering more about the natural world and living things.

We will be exploring our school and playground, making and following simple maps showing the parts that we know. We are also going to be looking at places in other parts of the world.

Let's explore!

We have a Geography focus this half term. We will be exploring who is part of a our school and the iobs they do. We will be making simple maps and labelling the main areas of the school we use. We will look at pictures and videos of places in other countries and compare them to where we live saying how they are the same and different.



Key Information

Your child will be given a RWI book, Phonics Book and a storybook every week to take home. Please read with your child and sign the reading record everyday.

Book bags with books and reading records should be brought to school every day. Research shows reading even five minutes a day can boost your child's development.

Please make sure your child's PE kit comes into school every Monday and is collected on Friday.

PE Kit: House colour top, shorts or tracksuit bottoms and plimsolls/trainers.

Children must also bring their full school uniform with them to school to change back into on PE days as they cannot stay in their PE Kit.

Our PE day is Wednesday.

Please read with your child and sign the Reading Log book every day. You can read any book you like so please take time to visit the local library to expand the books available for reading.

English

In English, pupils will have daily phonics lessons where they will be learning a new sound a day. Pupils will be learning to blend and segment sounds to develop their early reading skills.

This half terms key texts are: **The Gruffalo, We are Going on a Bear Hunt and Whatever Next.** We will be reading many more books along with these ones!

Computing

Pupils will be learning to take a photograph with a camera or tablet. They will be searching for information on the internet together with an adult. We will be playing games on the interactive whiteboard; children will have an opportunity to explore mechanical toys.

Mathematics

We are becoming masters on numbers 0-5.

- To say one number for each item in order.
- Count objects, actions and sounds.
- To show finger numbers up to 5.
- Develop fast recognition up to 3.
- Link numerals to amounts, up to 5.
- Exploring composition up to 5.
- Know that the last number reached is the total number.
- Experiment with their own symbols and marks as well as numerals.

PSED

This half term, the topic is My Emotions. For Reception, this involves getting to know each other. We will create a learning charter that helps us to learn well in our class. We will practise working cooperatively and collaboratively to enhance our social skills allowing a sense of community and belonging across the school.

Everybody in our school community has to travel to school. Everyone can do this differently.


Maps are pictures which show what places look like. You can use these to describe how you get to school.

Share attention

Be at the child's level. Pay attention to what they are focused on.



Respond

Follow the child's lead.
Respond to their non-verbal and verbal communications.
You could make a brief comment on what they can see, hear or feel.



Yes! It's getting taller!

Expand

Repeat what the child says and build on it by adding more words to turn it into a sentence.



Conversation

Have extended back and forth interactions. Give children time to listen, process and reply.
