Cornell Note Taking	Retrieval Practice
Cornell Note Taking - Summarise to key notes and then categorise the notes by adding cues/questions in the margin. Write a summary of the key pieces of learning at the bottom of the page. - Watch this video for more information on to consolidate learning using the Cornell system. You can also search for it by typing 'Learning Strategies Centre Cornell' on YouTube.	Blurting - Without looking at your notes write down everything you can remember about a sub- topic. - Check against your notes and add anything missed in a different colour. Look Cover Check Repeat - Spend 5 minutes reading over notes on a sub- topic. - Cover your notes and write down everything you can remember on some paper/in your green book. - Check your work against the original and repeat this process 3 times.
Quizzing	Exam Questions
- Give your notes to a peer/relative to quiz you. - Use online apps (Sparx, KayScience, Seneca, etc.) - Make Q&A flashcards and test yourself more frequently on questions you get wrong.	- Go to the assessment materials page for your exam board and practice some of the exam questions. - Compare against the mark scheme or ask your teacher for some feedback.
