


Contextualising our approach to Safeguarding.



### Our local area.

- Worst crime rate for burglary in Worcestershire.
- Most common offences are violence and sexual offences.
- Redditch is significantly higher for weapon possession than all other areas of Worcestershire.
- County lines and drug related offences are increasing amongst adolescents.






#### Trends

- Since the pandemic crime is on the rise.
- Drugs and Theft are still prevalent and increasing.
- Violent Crime is still a town wide issue.
- Antisocial behaviour is becoming a more prevalent issue in the local community.



## What does this mean at Ridgeway?

- Anti-Social behaviour and violent/sexual crimes are the most prevalent crimes in all of our catchment areas.
   Students living in the Redditch area are relatively more likely to have experienced violent or sexual crimes
- Domestic abuse will account for most of the incidents within the violent/sexual crimes category. As a school, we are supporting our students in developing their understanding of domestic abuse via our PSHE provision and Personal Development Time.
- There have been incidents of crime associated with drugs in all of our catchment areas, despite the
  numbers of these crimes being relatively low. This is an important consideration for our PSHE provision. We
  are educating our students about issues such as county lines by working in partnership with the
  Police/PCSO and delivering lessons on key topics in PSHE and PD time.
- Shoplifting is a significant issue in most of our catchment areas. Our school PSCO and links with the Police will be used to inform our students of the consequences of shoplifting.



## What does this mean at Ridgeway?

- Knife crime awareness is part of the personal development offer with a police endorsed programme delivered in school.
- All staff receive domestic abuse training to enable them to support and spot the signs of potential abuse.
- Students are made aware of healthy relationships and how to resolve conflict in a safe and controlled manner during PSHE lessons.
- The school leads a School and Police DSL Network half termly to discuss local context
