### PHILOSOPHY 4 CHILDREN

Last week's Philosophy 4 Children (P4C) session focussed on the environment.

Students were asked to reflect upon and to discuss whether environmental issues have deteriorated and slipped under the radar in recent times due to the pandemic. On the one hand it is estimated that carbon emissions dropped by 7% during lockdown (the biggest carbon crash on record). Conversely, around 94 million single-use plastic face masks and gloves have been used over the past year, which are finding their way into our rivers and seas.

Zubair, Deputy Student Leader and P4C Champion, said: It was a really engaging session. Students developed an understanding of environmental issues and were able to vent in a safe and regulated space. I think that many students left with the feeling that they can be part of change and that actions have consequences. I certainly left feeling empowered to do my part.

All students take part in P4C every half term, which is an enquiry based form of learning and provides an opportunity for them to engage in thought provoking and constructive discussion on a range of issues. All our recent P4C sessions have linked closely to current global events including COVID-19 vaccines, internet safety and Black Lives Matter.





### **GENOCIDE AWARENESS PROGRAMME**

In recognition of Genocide Awareness Month, a group of Key Stage 4 students took part in a virtual conference organised by our partner school, Stone Bridge High in the USA. The event aimed to raise awareness and remembrance of past and present atrocities. Students were encouraged to engage in thoughtful reflection and responsible discussion stimulated by presentations from a holocaust survivor and a descendant of the Armenian genocide.

A recording of the virtual programme was shared more widely in humanities lessons. Participation in this event builds on our ongoing partnership with Stone Bridge High and our next virtual meeting is scheduled for 4th May.
