Subject of Assessment

This Risk Assessment explains the actions of NCST schools to reduce the risk of transmission of Covid 19 in our school.

The actions have been identified and implemented in line with the document 'Schools Covid 19 Operational Guidance' <u>last updated - August 2021</u> by the UK Government. This government guidance is endorsed by Public Health England as part of Step 4 (the current phase of the government's response to the pandemic).

The following control measures have been identified by the government to create an environment where the risk of transmission is substantially reduced.

- 1. Ensure good hygiene for everyone.
- 2. Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes.
- 3. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.
- 4. Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19

Our actions are also in-line with the Newham 'Five Steps for Covid-19 Wellbeing'

All staff and students will be provided with and should use a Lateral Flow Device twice weekly at home Tests twice a week throughout September . The result of the tests should be reported to the school and the NHS. Vaccination 	Visitors and contractors will be encouraged to take LFD tests and report these to the school the day before their visit to the school.

			 The vaccination status of staff will be requested via completion of a Vaccination Google Form: Staff Vaccination Record Form Visible and visual signs throughout the school emphasise the messages of Covid Well-being. The school community will be made aware of the key symptoms and requirement not to attend school if unwell with key Covid Symptoms and /or tested positive (LFD tests or PCR). Staff will be encouraged to be vaccinated against Covid through regular messaging and the facilitation of vaccination appointments during working hours (when necessary)

Ventilation is promoted throughout the school to ensure the flow of fresh air and maintain a comfortable working environment (external windows and doors open, internal doors open and air handling units adjusted where possible.
