
What is Sociology?

Sociology is the study of society and everything that happens around us. The job of sociologists is to research **problems/issues** around us

and come up with solutions on how to tackle them.



What kind of problems do we look at?



What are the exams/assessments like?

Paper 1 – Family & Education (100 Marks / 1 Hour 45 Minutes) - 50%

In this exam students will explore family diversity and the issues that can occur in families. The second topic focuses on the education system and how it disadvantages different groups leading to gaps in attainment.

<u>Paper 2</u> – Crime & Deviance & Social Stratification (100 Marks / 1 Hour 45 Minutes) - 50%

In this exam students focus on the causes and levels of crime in society and how it impacts society. The second topic looks at the ranking of different people/groups and how that leads to inequality in society.
