

## **MEETING WITH ANGELA JACKMAN QC**

Ms Hendrickson's Year 11 English class recently had the opportunity to take part in a virtual meeting with Angela Jackman QC; an eminent and distinguished lawyer and academic. Ms Jackman spoke to our students about her background, what inspired her to get into law and her pathway into the profession. Students were able to ask her questions about her career and she shared top tips for young lawyers to be. She advised our students that if they are thinking about a career in law they need to be prepared to work consistently hard, to focus and commit to their goals and to consider voluntary work, mentoring and scholarship programmes to build up their CV.

Students felt that it was an honour to meet with Ms Jackman. She was the first in her family to go to university and the first African-Caribbean woman to study at Oxford University's Balliol College in 1981. In Decem-


ber 2020, she was appointed an Honorary Queen's Counsel by Her Majesty the Queen.



Amongst other positions, Ms Jackman is a Senior Lecturer at City University's Law School. She is cited as a leader in the fields of human rights law, education and mental capacity. She has had a number of reported cases across these disciplines. One of her particularly high profile cases includes *G v St Gregory's Catholic Science College* [2011] EWHC 1452 (Admin), the "cornrows school exclusion" judicial review case, in which the High Court held that a school's policy prohibiting African-Caribbean boys from wearing their hair in cornrows resulted in indirect racial discrimination.

Amongst other positions, Angela is a member of City University's Network for Racial Justice and Co-Chair of their Working Group for the success and progression of students of colour. She is also a member of the Law Society's Human Rights Committee, an expert panel member of the Strategic Legal Fund for Vulnerable Migrants and Programme Director for the LLB in Legal Practice – a truly remarkable woman!
