









YEAR 10 STUDENTS ATTEND LONDON CITY AIRPORT STEM IN AVIATION EVENT






Students from our Year 10 STEM programme had the opportunity to attend the STEM in Aviation Event held by London City Airport and ELBA at the ExCel Centre on Friday 4th November 2022.

The students were given the opportunity to learn more about STEM in different professional contexts, as well as developing their own STEM skills. they were also able to gain an insight into the work that is done by companies such as Boeing and Accenture.







Here are some words from Tamzid (Student Leader) and his thoughts on the trip.

"This trip was without a doubt very engaging, entertaining and informative, it consisted of four sessions, all of them being really fun and interesting. To begin with, we had a very warm welcome from everyone from City Airport and we were then sent for our sessions. In the first session, we had to make a wooden airplane and adjust it so that it would glide properly. In the second session, we learned about hydrogen powered airplanes in the future and how they were going to work and be designed. The third session was by far one of the most engaging ones, we were provided with paper in order to make a paper airplane, after that we raced them, it was a very entertaining experience. We then had a very nice lunch which we were all able to enjoy. In the fourth session we spoke about business in airports and engineering. At the end of the four sessions, a competition was held. We had to design our own airports, and different things that will help the airport such as bathrooms, solar panels, fountains, etc. At the end, all of the presentations were evaluated by judges. Overall it was a very informative trip that made me learn loads of new and interesting information as well as entertain me and I know that it was the same for everyone as well. 




