Project	Textiles Design - Year 10
<p>Project 1 'Cushion Project' September - December</p>	<p>The aim of the project is to ensure students learn key foundation skills: Hand and machine sewing, creating seams and pleats, applique, heat printing and familiarise themselves with the functions of a sewing machine.</p> <p>Students will design a cushion based on imagery, colour and texture from their visual investigations.</p> <p>Artists looked at: Robert and Lucienne Day / Mary White / Robert Stewart</p>
<p>Project 2 'Reworked : IKEA Challenge' January - May 1/2 term</p>	<p>Students will be set a challenge to create a new item using an old IKEA shopping bag.</p> <p>Students will research existing designs made from the same material before deciding what they wish to create.</p> <p>The final outcome should be a working, functional item. Students will learn how to work with more challenging, less traditional materials and develop their skills on the sewing machine.</p> <p>They will be introduced to techniques such as: - Creating lining - Padding - Adding zippers and buttons - Creating pockets and layers - Planning and designing a paper pattern.</p> <p>Students will choose the work of an eco designer from a wide selection provided by the teacher.</p>
<p>Project 3 'Engineered Garment' May 1/2 term Year 10 - December year 11</p>	<p>Students will be set a brief to create a worker Jacket from scratch.</p> <p>Students will use their investigative skills to draw out key concepts from historical, political and social contexts to develop message and meaning within their final outcomes.</p> <p>Students will study: Pattern cutting Sewing - Hems, Buttons, Zips, Collars and pockets. Printing - heat press, screen printing, block printing Shibori dyeing Sashiko embroidery</p>
