RSHE 2022-2023 Healthy Relationship Champion School Status



"In September 2022, Rokeby School became the UK's first Healthy Relationship Champion School after successfully completing Tender Education and Arts' RE:SET programme, in partnership with the Mayor's Office for Policing and Crime.

Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, visited Rokeby in November 2022 to launch his new campaign to end misogyny and get feedback from the students. Many of their opinions and attitudes about the importance of respect and equality were featured on ITV News, BBC London and in Cosmopolitan. Rokeby and Tender's partnership continues as we deliver workshops on healthy relationships and tackling discrimination to all Y9's and work collaboratively with staff to embed the knowledge they gained from training and resources Tender has shared".



P4C - Philosophy for Children- Staying Safe

As a Philosophy for Children Gold school, we now have 56 student P4C Champions. They have worked with teachers to plan and lead important P4C sessions on issues that are not only important to our local community, but also to wider society, such as; 'county lines', 'vaping' and 'consent'.





SHARP Project - Anti Knife Crime Ambassadors

Y9 and 10 students have worked in collaboration with Imperial College London and the Mayor's Violence Reduction Unit. This collaboration is to pilot a programme that brings together a multidisciplinary team including paramedics, police, an operating theatre team from the North West London Trauma Group (surgeon, anaesthetist and nurses), and 'simulated patients' (professional actors) portraying patient and family. The aim is to bring to life interactive workshops to explore the journey of a victim of knife crime through immersive simulation, working with professionals to deepen knowledge about the lasting consequences of carrying and using a knife.
























































































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






















































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Youth Safety Board - Newham Research Group



Members of our Youth Safety Board met with Esther from Newham Children's Services to discuss the safety of young people in Newham. Our students worked incredibly hard and their contributions will be used to help keep children and young people safe in our community. We are so impressed with the level of maturity they displayed and could not be prouder of them.

Rokeby Student Equalities Group (SEG)

The Student Equalities Group (SEG) are a student-lead group that champion diversity, equality and healthy relationships at Rokeby school. They meet once a week to plan ways to educate Rokeby students on the protected characteristics, through making displays, delivering assemblies and selecting the Thought of the Week. They also help to come up with new and inventive ways to celebrate students who contribute to healthy relationships such as, planning whole-school competitions around awareness days, and giving out regular awards.

The SEG had the pleasure of meeting the Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan; This visit was planned to celebrate the work of the SEG and accommodate the launch of his new educational toolkit which helps schools across London to tackle sexist and misogynistic behaviour. The Mayor and his team were blown away by the quality of the boys' discussion and commended them for their maturity, awareness and passion for social justice. Parts of the discussion were broadcast on live radio and BBC News.



Work Experience with the FCA



A further 18 students from Y10 are taking part in work experience with the FCA (Financial Conduct Authority) in Stratford. Students are learning about teamwork, leadership and presentation from professionals at the FCA. They also get a chance to work alongside the professionals on projects around budgeting and finance management.


