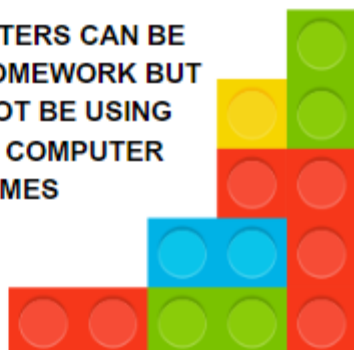

This week year 9 have been very busy responding to an artist.

For this project, year 9 have looked at the work of Klari Reis who creates petri dishes using resin and ink.

Year 9 used PVA glue, string, dye, sequins and rice to create shapes of cells and bacteria that were found in real petri dishes.

After photographs and drawings of their work are recorded in their books, they will begin to create patterns to be printed on fabric before turning them into textile artworks.
