This time of year gives us a great chance to reflect on the many things we have achieved together this term. We have a lot to celebrate and so, for a change, here are our some of our successes shown in numbers:

- ★ 1334 awesome students with great attitudes to their learning and their personal growth

- ★ Attendance is above national average and getting closer to our pre-covid level at 92.6%
- ★ 15 inspiring Teaching and Learning briefings( 10 min training sessions for all staff every Wednesday morning before school)
- ★ 35 practice GCSE examinations for Year 11 in the Exam Hall
- ★ 1 new website successfully launched
