## RE: Winter charity fundraising and foodbank appeal

At Sarah Bonnell we encourage students to be kind, act with consideration of others and be influential 21st century citizens committed to social justice. As the holiday season approaches, we are reminded of the importance of coming together as a school community to support those in need. This year, our school will be collecting for two important charities, as well as for a local food bank, in an effort to make a positive impact on the lives of children and families who are facing difficult circumstances.

As always we will be supporting **United World Schools**, an organisation dedicated to providing quality education to children in remote and underserved communities around the world.

We will also be raising funds for the **Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC)**, focusing particularly on their vital work in Palestine, where the ongoing crisis has left many children in urgent need of healthcare, education, and protection. The DEC's efforts are crucial in providing these children with a better future.

Finally, we will be collecting food donations for a local food bank – **The Renewal Programme**, which works to support families in our community who are struggling to meet their basic needs. Your generosity will help local families access essential food and resources during this festive season.

We recognise that this time of year can be challenging for many families, and we fully understand that resources may be stretched. Therefore, we want to make it clear that students will only be expected to donate what they can. There is absolutely no pressure to give beyond what feels manageable, and every contribution—whether small or large—will make a meaningful difference.

Items for The Renewal Programme food bank will be collected in form time from 9 - 16 December and students should only bring in non-perishable items from the following list:

- Pasta
- Rice
- Noodles
- Tin Tomatoes
- Tinned Chickpeas
- Baked beans

- Tuna/other tinned fish
- Cereals
- Dry lentils
- Baby formula milk 0-12 months
- Nappies from sizes 1-7
- Soaps/shampoos/ toiletries
