Attendance

Reminders for our basic equipment check every morning

In crew, every morning we complete a basic equipment check, The equipment expectations can be found below;

All students should have a;

- Bag
- Water bottle
- Reading book
- Pencil case containing Pen, Pencil, ruler, whiteboard pen (spares are available to purchase at 50p an item at the school office as needed)
- Charged iPad (this should be fully charged for the day ahead)
- PE Kit / outdoor kit when necessary

Mobile phones MUST NOT be used in school (in lines with national guidance), they should be turned off and in bags. Students found using their mobile phones in school will be asked to hand them to a staff member and left in the office to be collected at the end of the school day. Persistent misuse of mobile phones will result in appropriate consequences.

Car Park Safety Protocol

I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents about our system for using Car Park 3 to pick up and drop off students. We have seen some car park users driving into the safe zone and this is concerning.

Please could parents observe the speed limits so that students aren't put at risk and can we be patient with one another as the car park does get congested, particularly at the end of the day. If parents could continue to use the proposed routes as suggested in the picture below then we should be able to ensure a steady flow through the car park.

In addition, please could we ask that you switch your engine off whilst you wait, in the interests of keeping the environment as healthy as possible for our students and the wider community.
