Recapping times table facts of the 2, 5 and 10 times tables, using the inverse to solve division problems.


<u>Time:</u> Be able to tell the time to five minute intervals on an analogue clock.






Music

Growing and Changing

- -To recognise and name some feelings that they might have
- -To explain how feelings can make their bodies feel inside; to describe how others might be feeling
