What are we studying?

We follow the AQA French course. There are three themes covering four different skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing that will be tested in the GCSE exam. During year 10, we will cover listed themes and topics below:

- ❑ **Theme 1: Identity and culture:** family & relationships, free time & technology, customs & festivals
- ❑ **Theme 2: Local, National International & Global Areas of Interest:** holidays
- ❑ **Theme 3: Current and future study and employment:** school and further education

What you can do at home?



There are always something you can do to support your child's learning at home:

- ❑ Encourage your son/daughter to create a revision timetable to plan their time.
- ❑ Encourage them to complete speaking booklet and practise answers by talking loudly and record it.
- ❑ Encourage your son/daughter to create flash cards (French on one side and English on the other side) or summarise a topic on each card and test themselves on the content.
- ❑ Encourage them to revise **little and often**. Small chunks at a time but regularly.

Your child will be asked to join the Language Gym to practice listening, reading & grammar. Variety of learning activities to make language learning more engaging and fun.



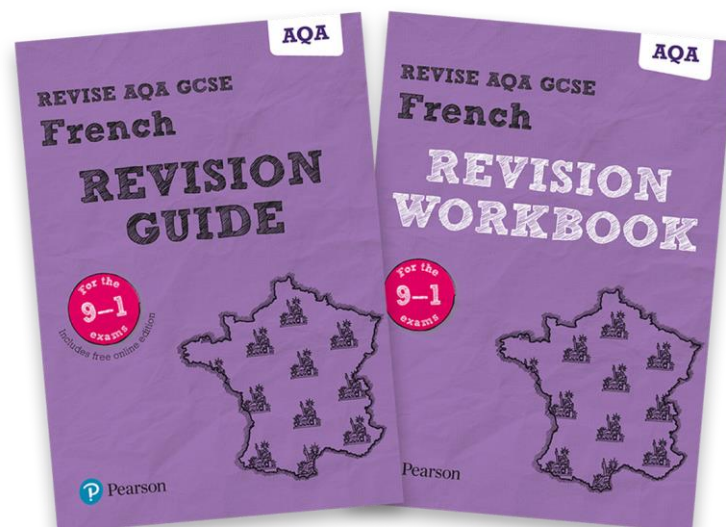
Speaking booklet: a booklet with all possible GCSE speaking questions on.

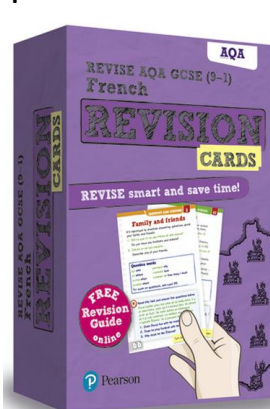
