1. Equality	The idea that people should be treated the same, and that differences in belief, race, gender, or sexuality should not change that.	14. Sewa	The idea of serving others in Sikhism. Sikhs are encouraged to serve all people as they contain the light of God.
2. Discrimination	Negative actions towards a person or group because of who they are.	15. Same sex relationship	A relationship between two people who are the same sex.
3. Christian	A person who follows the religion Christianity. The Bible is their holy text.	16. Inerrant	If something has no errors. Some Christians believe the Bible is inerrant, it has no errors.
4. Image of God	The idea that all people are made by God, and are therefore special.	17. Catholic Church	The largest denomination of Christianity in the world. It has over a billion members.
5. Sacred	Holy, or special to God.	18. Pope	The head of the Catholic Church, currently Pope Francis.
6. CAFOD	The Catholic Agency for Overseas Development. It is a Catholic charity that gives help to people around the globe in poverty.	19. Priest	Often the term used by Catholics and the church of England for the leader of a church.
7. Long term aid	Helping people by giving them solutions that will last a long time and should help reduce poverty and suffering in the future.	20. Church of England	The largest denomination of Christianity in the UK Started by Henry VIII in 1534.
8. Short term aid	Giving help that responds quickly to a situation.	21. Gender Equality	The idea that men and women should be treated the same.
9. Relative Poverty	When a person cannot afford the things that other people can in their country.	22. Blessing Service	A church service that might be done instead of a wedding for a same sex couple in the church.
10. Absolute Poverty	When a person cannot afford the basic things needed to live.	23. Racism	Treating a person or group differently based on their skin colour or ethnicity.
11. Trussell Trust	A Christian charity that operates many of the food banks in the UK.	24. Leviticus	The third book of the Bible that contains many rules and laws for the Jewish people.
12. Guru Gobind Singh	The last of the ten gurus in Sikhism. He started the Khalsa, the ongoing Sikh community.	25. Martin Luther King Jr	A civil rights leader in the USA in the 1950s and 1960s who tackled racism with peaceful protest.
13. Langar	A kitchen in a Sikh place of worship, designed to feed anyone who comes to it.	26. Hate Crime	A crime that is done to someone because of an aspect of their identity i.e. race, religion, sexuality.
