

1	<b>Sex</b>	Described biological differences between males and females.	11	<b>Influence</b>	The ability to have an effect on the behaviour, development or character of someone/thing.
2	<b>Gender</b>	The socially constructed roles, behaviours, activities and attributes that a given society considers appropriate for men and women.	12	<b>Religious Discrimination</b>	is treating individuals differently because of their religious beliefs and practices
3	<b>Homophobia</b>	An extreme and irrational aversion to homosexuality and homosexual people.	13	<b>Religious prejudice</b>	Pre-judge something or someone based on their religion, usually without any real evidence to base that judgement
4	<b>Gender discrimination</b>	When someone is treated unequally or disadvantageously based on their gender.	14	<b>Self worth</b>	The internal sense of being good enough and worthy of love and belonging from others.
5	<b>Homosexual</b>	Attracted to members of one's own sex.	15	<b>Self esteem</b>	How we value and perceive ourselves. It's based on our opinions and beliefs about ourselves, which can feel difficult to change.
6	<b>Heterosexual</b>	Is attracted to people of the opposite sex.	16	<b>Confidence</b>	Feeling sure of yourself and your abilities — not in an arrogant way, but in a realistic, secure way.
7	<b>Bisexual</b>	Romantic attraction, sexual attraction or sexual behaviour toward both males and females.	17	<b>Tolerance</b>	Willingness to accept feelings, habits, or beliefs that are different from your own.
8	<b>Pansexuality</b>	Sexual, romantic, or emotional attraction towards people of all genders, or regardless of their sex or gender identity.	18	<b>Respect</b>	To show consideration and regard for someone or something.
9	<b>Beliefs</b>	Our opinions that we accept as true but without always having proof or evidence. Beliefs are assumptions we make about the world.	19	<b>Cancel Culture</b>	Refers to the practice of withdrawing support for (cancelling) public figures after they have done or said something considered objectionable or offensive.
10	<b>Personal values</b>	Things that we attach importance to and live by e.g. equality, wisdom and compassion. Values define who we are as individuals and can say a lot about a person.	20	<b>Censorship</b>	The act of forbidding or banning something.
