

1	<b>Role model</b>	Someone who is worthy of imitation. A role model is someone who inspires others to imitate their good behaviour.	10	<b>Grooming</b>	When a person builds a relationship with a child, young person or an adult who's at risk so they can abuse them and manipulate them into doing things. The abuse is usually sexual or financial, but it can also include other illegal acts
2	<b>Organised criminal gang</b>	A group of individuals for whom involvement in crime is for personal gain (financial or otherwise). For most crime is their 'occupation	11	<b>Exploitation</b>	Where an individual or group takes advantage of an imbalance of power to coerce, manipulate or deceive a child or young person under the age of 18 into any activity.
3	<b>Coercion</b>	The practice of persuading someone to do something by using force or threats.	12	<b>Prescription drugs</b>	Drugs that require a prescription because they are considered to be potentially harmful if not used under the supervision of a licensed health care practitioner. Certain prescription drugs have additional controls placed upon them.
4	<b>Identity</b>	Our sense of who we are as individuals and as members of social groups. It also refers to our sense of how others may perceive and label us.	13	<b>Opiates</b>	These are painkillers.
5	<b>Peer group</b>	A relatively small and transient social grouping which may or may not describe themselves as a gang depending on the context.	14	<b>Depressants</b>	These are used to relieve anxiety or help a person sleep.
6	<b>Street gang</b>	Groups of young people who see themselves (and are seen by others) as a discernible group for whom crime and violence is integral to the group's identity.	15	<b>Stimulant</b>	A class of drug that elevates a person's mood, intensifies feelings of well-being, and increases energy and alertness
7	<b>County Lines</b>	Gangs send young people from cities into smaller towns and villages in order to sell drugs to the people living in these areas.	16	<b>Over-the-counter (OTC)</b>	Medicines that can be sold directly to people without a prescription. OTC medicines treat a variety of illnesses and their symptoms including pain, coughs and colds.
8	<b>Disenchantment</b>	To be disillusioned, in this case with society, and not feeling like there is no part in it for you and you could never play a successful role	17	<b>Addiction</b>	Not having control over doing, taking or using something to the point where it could be harmful to you.
9	<b>Trap House</b>	A base used for drug operations, usually a person's home who has been bribed or threatened into the situation.	18	<b>Drug addiction</b>	Chronic, relapsing disorder characterised by compulsive drug seeking and use despite adverse consequences.
