

1	Cancer	A disease caused by an uncontrolled division of abnormal cells in a part of the body.	11	Secondary Breast Cancer	When cancer cells from the breast have spread to other parts of the body such as the bones, lungs, liver or brain. (Stage 4 breast cancer)
2	Genetic predisposition	Increased likeliness relating to genes or heredity. A person may be more genetically predisposed to certain cancers due to the genes they inherited from their parents.	12	Five five most common warning signs in young people?	Lumps, bumps and swelling. Unexplained tiredness. Changes to moles. Persistent pain. Unexplained weight change.
3	Ultrasound scan	Uses high frequency sound waves to produce an image.	13	Cosmetic surgery	Enhancing the appearance through medical or surgical techniques
4	Biopsy	Removal of tissue by a needle that is then examined under a microscope.	14	Botox	A drug prepared from botulin, used cosmetically to remove wrinkles by temporarily paralysing facial muscles
5	Chemotherapy	A treatment that destroys cancer cells. It is chemotherapy treatment that can lead to a loss of hair for a cancer patient.	15	Collagen	The main structural protein found in skin and other connective tissues, widely used in purified form for cosmetic surgical treatments
6	Lumpectomy	A surgical procedure to remove a lump believed to be cancerous.	16	Lip augmentation	A cosmetic procedure that promises to give fuller, plumper lips.
7	Mammogram	A breast x-ray.	17	Liposuction	A technique in cosmetic surgery which removes fat from under the skin by suction
8	Oncologist	A doctor who specialises in cancer.	18	Fat embolism	A condition that occurs when fat enters the bloodstream and obstructs blood vessels
9	Mastectomy	Removal of all the breast tissue including the nipple area.	19	General anaesthetic	An anaesthetic that affects the whole body causing a loss of consciousness, given before surgery.
10	Radiotherapy	A treatment that uses high energy x-rays to destroy cancer cells.	20	NHS	National Health Service. Government-funded medical and health care services that everyone living in the UK can use without being asked to pay the full cost of the service.
