8	Motivation			o e: o	our character's motivation is what drives them r what they would like to achieve. For kample, a character may behave in a childish r argumentative way but their overall notivation is to be noticed and get attention.
9	Writing in Role			W a	riting from a character's perspective, typically diary entry; a letter, email, or text.
10	Status			С	he level of power or influence a character has. haracters with high status control those of low ratus. E.g. A prison guard and a prisoner.



## TIMELINE OF THE HOLOCAUST



- 1933 Adolf Hitler is appointed chancellor of Germany, soon he becomes president.
- 1934 Jews were banned from the German Labor Front, banned from having health insurance, jews are prohibited from getting legal qualifications.
- 1938 Nazi troops enter into Austria. And established a concerntration camp.
- 1940 Nazi invade Denmark, Poland, France, Belgium, Holland, Lexumbourge within this year.
- 1941 Japanese attacked United States Pearl Harbor. The next day the U.S. Declare war on Japan
- 1942 Adolf begins mass killings of jews using Zyklon B
- 1944 Beginning of deportation of Jews from Hungary to Auschwitz.
- 1945 Hitler is captured and later on commits suicide.
- 1960 Hitler Eichmann gets captured, Eichmann goes on trial in Jerusalem for crimes against the Jewish people, crimes against humanity and war crimes. Found guilty and hanged at Ramleh on May 31, 1962.
