## ROSE BLANCHE

### KEY TERMINOLOGY

1	<b>Roleplay</b>			Acting, portraying a character, being somebody other than yourself. Playing a role.
2	<b>Still Image</b>			A frozen picture which communicates meaning. Also called a freeze frame. There is a clear focus upon use of levels, body language and facial expression.
3	<b>Thought Tracking</b>			When a character steps out of a scene to address the audience about how they're feeling. Sharing thoughts in this way provides deeper insight into the character.
4	<b>Monologue</b>			A speech delivered by one person usually expressing a character's thoughts and feeln
5	<b>Marking the Moment</b>			To highlight a key moment in a scene. This can be done by using slow-motion, a still image, thought-tracking or music. It has a similar effect to using a spotlight to focus attention on one area of the stage at a particular moment.
6	<b>Devising</b>			To create your own performance, usually in response to a stimulus. The actors develop the dialogue through improvisation.
7	<b>Hot Seating</b>			An actor sits in the hot-seat and is questioned in role, spontaneously answering questions they may not have considered before.
8	<b>Motivation</b>			Your character's motivation is what drives them or what they would like to achieve. For example, a character may behave in a childish or argumentative way but their overall motivation is to be noticed and get attention.
9	<b>Writing in Role</b>			Writing from a character's perspective, typically a diary entry; a letter, email, or text.
10	<b>Status</b>			The level of power or influence a character has. Characters with high status control those of low status. E.g. A prison guard and a prisoner.

### LANGUAGE OF THE ROLE

#### VOCAL SKILLS

Accent, pitch, pace, volume, emphasis, pause, tone.

#### PHYSICAL SKILLS

Body language, posture, movement, proxemics, levels, touch, facial expression, eye contact, gesture, gait.

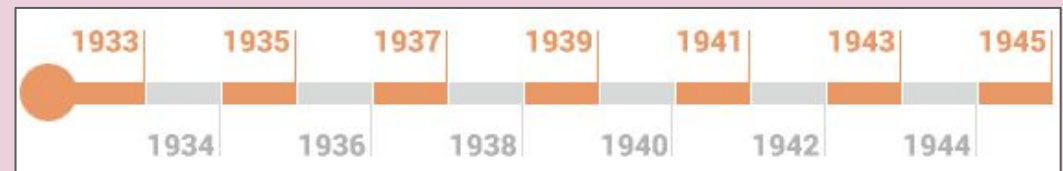

### TIMELINE OF THE HOLOCAUST



1933 - Adolf Hitler is appointed chancellor of Germany, soon he becomes president.

1934 – Jews were banned from the German Labor Front, banned from having health insurance, jews are prohibited from getting legal qualifications.

1938 – Nazi troops enter into Austria. And established a concerntration camp.

1940 – Nazi invade Denmark, Poland, France, Belgium, Holland, Lexumbourge within this year.

1941 – Japanese attacked United States Pearl Harbor. The next day the U.S. Declare war on Japan

1942 – Adolf begins mass killings of jews using Zyklon B

1944 - Beginning of deportation of Jews from Hungary to Auschwitz.

1945 – Hitler is captured and later on commits suicide.

1960 – Hitler Eichmann gets captured, Eichmann goes on trial in Jerusalem for crimes against the Jewish people, crimes against humanity and war crimes. Found guilty and hanged at Ramleh on May 31, 1962.
