<b>1. Universe</b>	All of time and space consisting of all the stars and planets.	<b>14. Cosmetic Testing</b>	Testing on animals for products like makeup to check that they are safe for humans.
<b>2. Big Bang</b>	A massive expansion of space that created the universe.	<b>15. Medical Testing</b>	Testing on animals to make sure that medicine is safe for humans.
<b>3. Literalist Christians</b>	A group that interprets the Bible literally, and believes in the Genesis creation story word for word.	<b>16. Vegetarian</b>	Not eating animals or meat.
<b>4. Liberal Christians</b>	A group of Christians that see the Genesis story as a metaphor to describe the creation of the universe.	<b>17. Halal</b>	Food which is acceptable for Muslims. Animals have to be killed in a certain way in order to be halal.
<b>5. Awe and wonder</b>	The idea that humans look at the universe and are impressed by its complexity.	<b>18. Sanctity of Life</b>	The idea that all life is special (sacred) and so cannot be taken by humans.
<b>6. Responsibility</b>	A duty of care for something or someone	<b>19. Quality of Life</b>	The idea that a person should enjoy their life, or be free from excessive suffering.
<b>7. Stewardship</b>	The idea that humans should look after the world on behalf of God.	<b>20. Abortion</b>	The ending (termination) of a pregnancy.
<b>8. Dominion</b>	The have control over something.	<b>21. Ensoulment</b>	The idea that a human receives a soul during pregnancy.
<b>9. Khalifah</b>	The Islamic belief in stewardship.	<b>22. Euthanasia</b>	A “good death” in Greek, this term means ending a person's life before it would naturally end to prevent suffering,
<b>10. Pollution</b>	Making something dirty or contaminated, especially the environment.	<b>23. Active Euthanasia</b>	This involved giving the person something (e.g. a drug) that would end the person's life.
<b>11. Natural resources</b>	Materials found in nature, such as oil and trees.	<b>24. Passive Euthanasia</b>	This involves withdrawing medical support, and allowing the person to die naturally.
<b>12. Non-renewable resources</b>	Resources that we can use but there are only a limited amount of them.	<b>25. Pro Life</b>	A group that says that women should be allowed to choose to have an abortion.
<b>13. Environment</b>	The natural world, the surroundings in which something lives.	<b>26. Pro Choice</b>	A group that says that the right to life of the foetus is the most important, and that abortion should not be allowed.
