<b>1. Christian</b>	A person who believes in Jesus Christ and follows his teachings.	<b>14. Messiah</b>	A saviour promised by God, whom Christians believe is Jesus Christ.
<b>2. Protestant</b>	A Christian who belongs to a group that separated from the Catholic Church during the Reformation.	<b>15. Disciple</b>	A follower of Jesus, especially one of his twelve closest friends and helpers.
<b>3. Catholic</b>	A Christian who follows the teachings and traditions of the Roman Catholic Church, led by the Pope.	<b>16. Parable</b>	A simple story told by Jesus to teach a moral or religious lesson.
<b>4. Purgatory</b>	In Catholic belief, a place where souls are purified before they can go to heaven.	<b>17. Parable of the unforgiving servant</b>	A story Jesus told about a servant who was forgiven a big debt but wouldn't forgive someone who owed him a little, teaching the importance of forgiveness.
<b>5. Reformation</b>	A period in history when people tried to change the Catholic Church, leading to the creation of Protestant churches.	<b>18. Golden Rule</b>	Jesus' teaching that you should treat others the way you want to be treated.
<b>6. Nature of God</b>	The characteristics and qualities that describe what God is like, such as being all-powerful and loving.	<b>19. Forgive 70 x 7</b>	Jesus' teaching that we should forgive others many times, meaning always.
<b>7. Trinity</b>	The Christian belief that God is three persons in one: the Father, the Son (Jesus), and the Holy Spirit.	<b>20. Sin</b>	An action or thought that goes against God's laws and teachings.
<b>8. Father</b>	God the Father is the first person of the Trinity, seen as the creator and protector.	<b>21. John 3:16</b>	A Bible verse that says God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so anyone who believes in him will have eternal life.
<b>9. Son</b>	Jesus Christ is the Son of God and the second person of the Trinity.	<b>22. Crucifixion</b>	The method of execution where Jesus was nailed to a cross and died, an important event in Christianity.
<b>10. Holy Spirit</b>	The third person of the Trinity, who Christians believe helps and guides them.	<b>23. Atonement</b>	The belief that Jesus' death on the cross made up for the sins of people, allowing them to be forgiven by God.
<b>11. Jesus</b>	The Son of God in Christianity, who Christians believe came to earth to teach, heal, and save people.	<b>24. Omnipotent</b>	All-powerful
<b>12. Incarnation</b>	The Christian belief that God became human in the person of Jesus Christ.	<b>25. Omnibenevolent</b>	All-loving
<b>13. Healing of the paralysed man</b>	A miracle story where Jesus heals a man who couldn't walk, showing his power and compassion.	<b>26. Omniscient</b>	All-knowing
