Specification

The nature of God:

God as omnipotent, loving and just, and the problem of evil and suffering

the oneness of God and the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Different Christian beliefs about the afterlife and their importance, including: resurrection and life after death; judgement, heaven and hell.
