A religion based on the life, teachings, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Christians believe Jesus is the Son of God and the Savior of humanity.	14. Love your neighbour as yourself	A commandment taught by Jesus that emphasises treating others with the same care and respect as you would want for yourself.
Central figure of Christianity, believed by Christians to be the Son of God and the Messiah.	15. Unforgiving servant	A parable where a servant is forgiven a large debt but refuses to forgive a smaller debt owed to him.
Judaism is a monotheistic religion that traces its origins to the covenant between God and Abraham.	16. Nicene Creed	A statement of Christian faith that was formulated at the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD.
A country in the Middle East and the historical homeland of the Jewish people.	17. God	The supreme being, creator, and ruler of the universe.
A figure in Jewish and Christian belief who is expected to bring salvation to the people.	18. Humanity	Humanity is created in the image of God but has also fallen due to sin.
Being chosen or set apart by God for a special purpose or mission. In biblical tradition, anointing with oil symbolised this divine selection.	19. Divinity	In Christianity, Jesus is recognized as fully divine (God) as well as fully human.
An extraordinary event that cannot be explained by natural or scientific laws	20. Cross	A symbol of Christianity, representing the instrument of Jesus' crucifixion and His sacrificial death for the salvation of humanity.
One of the miracles of Jesus where he walked on the surface of the Sea of Galilee to reach his disciples.	21. Crucifixion	The Roman method of execution where a person is nailed or bound to a cross.
An account where Jesus heals a man who is paralysed, demonstrating his power to heal physical ailments and forgiving sins.	22. Sin	Any act, thought, or behaviour that goes against what God wants.
A major pilgrimage site for Catholics seeking healing, especially at its waters.	23. Salvation	Being freed from the consequences of sin.
A simple story used by Jesus to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson.	24. Original sin	The concept that humanity inherited a sinful nature due to the first sin committed by Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden.
A parable told by Jesus about a man from Samaria who helps a wounded traveller after others passed by.	25. John 3:16	"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life."
A teaching of Jesus that emphasises limitless forgiveness.	26. Heaven	It is often depicted as a place of peace, joy, and the presence of God. A place humans might go after death.
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
