1. Morality	Humans' attempt to distinguish between right and wrong.	14. Punishment	A consequence for an action that was negative.
2. Good	An action that may be seen to be positive, right, or promote happiness.	15. Retribution	The idea that the aim of punishment should be for revenge or to deal equivalent damage to the offender.
3. Evil	An action that is seen as wrong, or creates suffering. The opposite of good.	16. Rehabilitation	The aim of punishment is to correct or treat the offender to prevent future offences.
4. Divine Command Theory	The idea that God commands humans to act a certain way. What God tells humans to do is good.	17. Deterrence	A punishment that aims to prevent crimes by causing fear.
5. Ten Commandments	A list of rules that are used By Jews, Christians and Muslims to live a good life.	18. Prison	An establishment that is designed to house criminals for a set amount of time as a form of punishment.
6. Moses	A Jewish prophet to whom God delivered the ten commandments on Mount Sinai.	19. Death Penalty	A punishment that takes the life of an offender.
7. Utilitarianism	A belief that an action is good if it creates, "The greatest good for the greatest number".	20. Protection	An aim of punishment where violent or dangerous offenders are removed from society.
8. Designer Baby	Genetically engineering a baby to meet certain "desirable" criteria.	21. Abortion	The termination of a pregnancy.
9. Eugenics	The belief that certain genes are preferable.	22. Sanctity of Life	The belief that all life is sacred and belongs to God. Only God can give and take life.
10. Weapon	Something used to harm others.	23. Euthanasia	The ending of a life before its natural end, often in the case of a terminal illness.
11. Sikhism	A religion that started in the Indian subcontinent.		
12. 5ks	Five religious items that Sikhs have at all times.		
13. Kirpan	A ceremonial short sword carried by Sikhs, allowed by UK law.
