# BRASS BAND CONCERT IS

An audience of 600 people plus thousands more watching live on the internet enjoyed the show when a Shirebrook Academy and a world-famous brass band joined forces to give a debut performance of a brand new piece of music.

Members of the Shirebrook Academy Wind Band took to the stage alongside the world-famous Black Dyke Brass Band during a one-off concert, when they gave the first-ever performance of a 15-minute composition called Child's Play.

Young singers from local primary school choirs and the Shirebrook Miner's Welfare brass band also took part in the performance, which was the highlight of a concert given by Black Dyke at the Academy.

The event was held as the culmination of a project led by Bolsover District Council and Shirebrook Town Council and made possible with the help of funding from Arts Council England's Grants for Arts scheme.

It involved students at the Academy working alongside the Yorkshire-based Black Dyke's conductor Dr Nicholas Childs, who passed on their suggestions and input to Child's Play's composer, Paul Lovatt-Cooper.

The piece is designed to accompany a short film of the same name, which looks at the ways in which children's play and games has changed over the years, from the Victorian Times to the present day.

The film is narrated by BBC Radio 2's Listen to the Band presenter Frank Renton, who also compered the concert, which was streamed live on the internet.

Shirebrook Academy Head of Music Adam Case said: "The whole concert was beyond expectations. The sports hall was packed to the rafters and there were people watching the live stream in Australia, the USA and other places in the world.

The commissioned piece featured 90 musicians performing alongside a chorus of students from Model Village and Saint Joseph's primary schools and sounded absolutely incredible. We've had some excellent feedback including lots of messages on Twitter complementing the show.

Our wind band members are aged between 12 and 15 and they worked incredibly hard in the run-up to the concert. They gave an excellent performance on the night and they can all be extremely proud of themselves." Law S

# SPORT

September ended with a busy week of fixtures for the Academy, 8 fixtures in just 3 days. The first being back to back football matches for both the Y11 boys and girls. The boys played at home against Tibshelf and the girls were away at Wath Comprehensive. Unfortunately, both games ended in defeat for the Academy. There were however goals for both teams from Amber Newton and Keiran Darby.

The following day we had over 50 students take part in fixtures, with every year group represented.

The Y7 and 8 girls had an ESFA football match against Lady Manners and despite losing the game, the girls played well. From conceding 2 early goals the girls battled hard and a goal from Georgie Shaw made it 2-1. They pushed hard for an equaliser but were unable to find one and conceded a third goal late on, losing the game 3-1.

The Y8 boys also suffered a 3-1 defeat in their ESFA match against West Park. The goal scorer for the Academy was Fraser Howarth.

The Y10 and 11 girls bounced back from their earlier defeat, winning one game, and drawing a game. Mr Simpson was encouraged by the performance and gave special mention to Terri-Ann Parkin for her performances during the tournament.

The Y11 boys were beaten in extra time in their game with Lady Manners. The game moved in to extra time following a 1-1 draw in normal time. The Academy's goal coming from Tommy Jacques.


The Y8 and 9 netball team won their round robin tournament remaining unbeaten

throughout. A 3-1 victory against Fredrick Gents and a 4-1 victory against Tibshelf saw the girls finish top of the table. Miss Smith praised everyone involved. The following night saw fixtures for the Y9 boys football team in a round robin tournament against Fredrick Gents and Heritage and the Y7 Rugby boys attending another camp.

The Y9 boys finished joint top in their round robin, finishing unbeaten. The boys recorded a 6-0 victory over Fredrick Gents and drew 3-3 with Heritage. Mr Beecham gave a special mention to Kian Tansley who scored 7 of the academy's 9 goals.

October saw the Y7's progressing in the national cup with an impressive 5-2 victory over Westbourne School. The Academy were trailing 2-0 after just 10 minutes but rallied around to draw level by half time. A strong second half display saw the Academy dominate and run out comfortable winners. The team will play Ashfield in the second round later this month.

The Y8, 9, 10 and 11's however were knocked out of the national cup in their games. The standout game saw the Y9's battle from 4-0 down to 4-4 after conceding 3 penalties before eventually losing the game 5-4 in the last minute.
