

Music Lessons

Does your child have an interest in learning to play a musical instrument?

Here at the Academy we have an excellent team of specialist musicians who visit us weekly to provide lessons in brass (trumpet, cornet, horn, trombone, euphonium and tuba), woodwind (flute, clarinet and saxophone), strings (violin and viola), guitar (electric, acoustic and bass) and drum kit.

Learning an instrument is an excellent way to develop self-esteem, resilience, organisation, coordination, thinking skills and problem solving as well presenting the opportunity to make new friends and gain confidence. Once your child has made progress on their instrument they will be invited to join one of the Academy's musical ensembles such as Wind Band, Funky Jazz Band, String Orchestra or Choir. They may also have the opportunity to take part in concerts and showcases throughout the year.

All lessons take place during the school day on a rotating timetable to avoid disruption to students' learning.

Lessons are offered at an introductory price for the first six weeks, following this time prices may vary but subsidies are available subject to circimstances.

If your child is interested, have them collect a letter from Mr Case in the music department.

School Gateway is available right now and is the simplest way to stay up to date with what's going on at school, so make sure you download the App for free. Just search School Gateway in your App store and download.






With the exception of Y11 Core PE group, <u>ALL</u> year groups should bring full PE kit to school and get changed accordingly.

CAREERS

We know that parents are a key influence and support for students when they are deciding what to do after Y11, and we want to ensure you have all the information you need. Normally we would run a Careers Evening in school for Y10/ Y11 and their parents to learn about all the options and meet local colleges, 6th forms and training providers. This year we will need to work a little differently.....

- You will see regular bulletins on this newsletter about Post-16 and Careers topics
- Mrs Horton will be emailing students a regular bulletin with specific information and links, for example reminders about open days
- All Y11 students will be bringing home a guide to Post-16 options called 'Its Your Choice'. The guide contains a really helpful section for parents so please ask to see it!
- Please contact me at Shirebrook Academy by phone or email thorton@shirebrookacademy.org if you have any specific queries or would like to discuss careers/Post-16 ideas for your son/daughter
- A separate letter will be sent to Y10 parents about our plans for work experience this year

So, what can you do to support your Y11 son/ daughter?

Look at local college and 6th form websites to find out what courses they offer and when to apply. Students can apply any time from now onwards. We recommend students apply to more than one option, then decide which they prefer later in the year.

Colleges and 6th forms will be running virtual open days/ open evenings (see their websites for details). For example – West Notts College and Chesterfield College. These open events offer a good opportunity to speak to staff and students directly, and there will be talks on applications, different subjects and issues such as finance.

Character Education

We are excited to be working with The Centre for Student and Community Engagement (CenSCE) at Nottingham Trent University (NTU) on a project to develop Character Education at Shirebrook Academy

Our Mission Statement states that one of our goals is to foster the values and character traits that make us fully rounded adults who make a positive contribution to our community – compassion, honesty, integrity, courage, kindness.

Ofsted recognises the link between character and successful outcomes for young people. Ofsted define character as:

"A set of positive personality traits, dispositions and virtues that informs pupils motivations and guides their conduct so that they reflect wisely, learn eagerly, behave with integrity and cooperate consistently well with others. This gives pupils the qualities they need to flourish in our society".

At Shirebrook Academy we already have an established character education programme that includes, but is not limited to, the provision of a personal development curriculum across all year groups within the Academy delivered weekly with additional drop-down days, external speakers and visits throughout the year. Students are provided with opportunities within the co-curriculum to develop their character through participation in activities such as:

- CRESST empowering students to manage their own conflict resolution
- Ambassadors
- Junior Leadership Team
- Fundraising
- Leading Events
- Youth council
- Sports Leadership
- Duke of Edinburgh

This project will build on those existing activities and embed character education into the language of the school, the curriculum and our behaviour and rewards systems.

Parents and carers can help by praising children when they exhibit those positive character traits – 'well done for having the courage to try to learn new skills' or 'thank you for being kind to your sister'. You can also use the traits to point out when they get things wrong. For example, 'are you showing kindness?' can be more powerful than 'stop being mean!' whilst 'thank you for your honesty' is a good way of saying well done for owning up to doing something wrong!

Dream Catching

Y9 textile students have been working really hard recently getting to grips with weaving on a CD. The aim was to make dream catchers and the theme for the project was 'under the sea'. Students were free to choose colours to suit their theme.
