Area	Modern Foreign Languages links
Citizenship	<p>Students develop an appreciation and awareness of culture, different lifestyles and religions through our rich SoWs</p> <p>Content of SoWs allows students to consider things such as how to protect the environment, save endangered species, help the homeless etc.</p> <p>Languages Week/Languages Ambassador scheme include activities where students take the lead on different cultural aspects</p>
RSHE	<p>SoW covers topics such as healthy lifestyle, healthy diet and relationships with friends and family members</p> <p>Lessons offer opportunities for group work, effective communication and building relationships</p>
SMSC	<p>Students develop an appreciation and awareness of culture, different lifestyles and religions through our rich SoWs</p>
PD	<p>Trips and visits which have a heavy link on languages in the real world, careers and developing character values</p>
English and maths – <i>motorways</i>	<p>English – tenses, multiple grammar concepts, extended writing for purpose, describing photos</p> <p>Maths – percentages, numbers, time</p>
Other subjects – ‘A Roads’	<p>Arts – cross curricular use of adjectives/descriptive terms to describe (such as colours, shapes, prepositions, comparisons and describing an image)</p> <p>Technology/PE – Languages Week links to careers (such as chef, sports player), topics on SoW linked to careers in sport/catering, topic of food/drink and sports is covered regularly in spiral curriculum</p>
