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Dear Parents/Carers,

Dear students, parents, carers and members of the Shirebrook Academy community,

It has been a privilege to work with you as Principal of Shirebrook Academy over the past seven years. As you are no doubt aware I have been absent from school throughout 2022 due to ill health and have taken the decision to retire from teaching this summer after 30 years working in schools. When I started as a history teacher back in 1992 I wanted to do everything I could to help young people grow into confident, open minded and empowered citizens and becoming a school leader enabled me to go some way to fulfilling that goal. There are many highlights to look back on from my time at Shirebrook and through all my communication with you and the world beyond Shirebrook I have looked to celebrate the achievements and qualities of our young people and of this special community - you all have so much to be proud of and to look forward to. But it is the day to day interactions with our students, the fun and variety that comes from working with our young people and seeing them learn and grow that I will look back on with most fondness and will miss the most. I have always told our students and staff that qualifications are important but that education is about so much more than grades in exams. Real education lasts a lifetime, it should inspire, enthuse and open young people to new experiences and new ways of thinking. As Principal at Shirebrook Academy I have always tried to balance the need for our students to gain good qualifications with having the space to grow, enjoy experiences, try new things and learn about themselves and the wider world. Remember, you will never regret trying something and failing - you will always learn from the experience, but you may live to regret missed opportunities that you didn't have the courage or drive to attempt. am glad I took the opportunity to lead Shirebrook Academy and I hope that whatever you do in the future or wherever you go you will speak as fondly and proudly of yourself, your school and your community as I will.
